## Notification of Requirement to Register

**To all residents, students, employees, employers, contractors, vendors, tenants, lessors, lessees (persons with an “employment-related presence”) on the Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe Reservation:**

### **Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe’s Sex Offender Registration Code**

On May 13, 2011, the Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe’s Board of Directors unanimously approved the passage of the Tribal Law and Order Code, Chapter 36, *Sex Offender Registration Code* to be **effective July 27, 2011**, in accordance with the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA) Title 1 of the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006 (P.L. 109-248), 42 U.S.C. 16911 et seq., as amended.

Accordingly, **all** convicted sex offenders or offenders with a criminal conviction for attempt or conspiracy to commit sex offenses, which includes both domestic and foreign convictions, **must** register with the Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe’s Tribal Police Department within three (3) business days of establishing residence, commencing employment or becoming a student within the Reservation boundaries and/or within seven (7) calendar days before leaving their Reservation residence for seven (7) or more days for a temporary visit elsewhere (“temporary lodging”).

**Failure to register, failure to keep registration current, absconding, or failure to abide by the provisions of the Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe Sex Offender Registration Code is a crime punishable by up to one (1) year imprisonment and/or a \$5,000 fine. Violations of this code shall also be considered a civil violation subject to enforcement by any means not prohibited by federal law, including, but not limited to, the issuance of fines, forfeitures, civil contempt, and exclusion or removal.**

**Sex offenders required to register under SORNA who knowingly fail to register or update a registration as required are subject to the federal criminal penalty punishable up to 10 years of imprisonment under 18 U.S.C §2250.**

**Knowingly harboring, attempting to harbor, or assisting another in harboring or attempting to harbor a sex offender who is in violation of the Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe Sex Offender Registration Code, knowingly assisting a sex offender in eluding a law enforcement agency that is seeking to find the sex offender, or knowingly providing false information to a law enforcement agency regarding a sex offender are crimes punishable by up to one (1) year imprisonment and/or a \$5,000 fine for each charge.**
